Kewstoke Road traffic Issues

A debate took place beginning to question whether the Road Traffic scheme would ever be effective and it was decided to now consider flashing speed lights as a possible deterrent. Clerk will try and get a representative down to discuss options

School Yellow Brick Road

NSDC indicated that this was not a priority and would be added to a list of future jobs Councillors voiced their concerns and other ways were discussed to get the roadway renewed.

Pot Holes

Some had been done but still many were outstanding. Wessex water has confirmed that none of the Manhole covers in three locations were their responsibility

Clerk will liaise with NSDC to see when action will occur

Dog Bins /Waste

Still awaiting a reply to letter sent after April meeting but Unitary members aware of situation Letter to be sent to Glendale thanking their operatives for helping to clear rubbish around bins particularly after the hot weekends.

13. Councillor's Reports

Cllr MacDonald raised with other Councillors the issue of the sand again on the path from the bus shelter to the Commodore Hotel area

Residents seem to think it is the Parish responsibility. The Clerk reported (as he understands it) that the actual position is that the issue is one of sea defences over paths however Cllr Adams when he can get some time from is farming work will take up his heavy duty tractor and clear the sand More pailing fencing might help but is of little use installing before October as it will be vandalised. **Cllr MacDonald** had a request to strim back the path near the Crookes Lane Bus shelter Clerk will try and get work done

Cllr Harper reported on some issue with locks at the toilets. These were ever going and long term some serious investment will have to be made to sort out these problems

Cllr Vearncombe reported on foul water being permanently running outside Risdales in Kewstoke Road. This has been reported before but has had no response from the residence or NSDC Councillors suspect this is from some kind of sewerage outlet

Cllr Morris asked for the grass to be strimmed on the triangle Kewstoke Road Clerk will action

Cllr Jenkins reminded everyone of the deadline which is approximately 8 weeks to the newsletter articles

Cllr Adams enquired if it was possible to repaint some of the road signs in the village. A volunteer did them last time and an effort would be made to see if he would continue to paint them again
